INTERNET SAFETY EDUCATION

The Kentucky Attorney General's Office is committed to working with students and parents in Kentucky to educate them about possible dangers that may result from being online, such as internet sex predators, cyberbullying and harassment, embarrassment and lost opportunities because of online postings, and identity theft. The Attorney General's Office of Consumer Protection has developed presentations for middle and high school students and parents.

***i-Assemblies for Middle and High Schools***

The assembly format for middle and high school students is a one-hour presentation covering internet sex predators, cyber-bullying, and safe, responsible online behavior in the social networking environment. The i-Assemblies use videos from the Internet Safety group i-Safe America portraying real life events that lead to young people becoming a victim of predators and cyberbullying and public service announcements from the U.S. Department of Justice Project Safe Childhood on the "Think Before You Post" campaign. The presenters also portray images from students' MySpace pages showing the inappropriate conduct happening in their own school. A question-and-answer period is included to address concerns that students may have on internet safety.

***Parent Program***

The parent program is a one-hour presentation on dangers in the online environment such as internet sex predators, cyberbullying and identity theft. The presentation uses videos from the Internet Safety group i-Safe America portraying real life events that lead to young people becoming a victim of predators and cyberbullying. It includes information on how predators "groom" their victims, warning signs of child solicitation online, examples of social networking, and statistics on the number of children targeted by sexual predators and cyberbullying. The presenters also portray images from students' MySpace pages showing the inappropriate conduct happening in their students' own school. A question-and-answer period is included to help parents deal with what's happening in their own homes and communities.
